

EXODUS - A BETTER REST

Hebrews 3:7 – 4:11

Observations:

- The Rest of God is not salvation.
- The Rest of God is not the result of salvation.
- The Rest of God is not a picture of heaven.
- The Rest of God is available to all who are saved.
- The Rest of God is “labor” intensive.
- The Rest of God is a place of struggles.
- The Rest of God is a promise from God to all who are saved.
- Though available to all, it only avails to those who, by faith, are willing to enter.
- The Rest of God is both individual and corporate.
- The individuals who have faith are affected by those who don’t have faith.
- The conditions of God’s rest are affected by the choices of God’s people, not the lost.
- “In order for evil to prevail, good has to be silent and do nothing.”
- God intends for His people to affect the natural world into which they are placed.
- God intends for His people to rule in the natural world into which they are placed.
- Everyone and everything that resides in God’s intended purpose will benefit.
- The rest of God is a result of God’s faithful people being willing to war against evil.
- The rest of God is not a “quick fix” but is a lifetime result of trusting God.
- Sadly, most believers never enter into God’s intended rest.
- God’s leaders should never be moved by the will of the majority, only by God.
- God’s leaders should LEAD people into God’s fullness for their lives.
- God will ultimately fulfill His promises. If one generation refuses His best, another will rise and take their place.
- Will we be of the minority who have the faith to “enter into God’s rest?”
